Civil Liberties: Rein in Department of Homeland Security Travel Abuses

Write to your senators and congressional representatives and urge them to introduce legislation that would halt civil rights abuses of travelers by the Department of Homeland Security.

BACKGROUND

According to published policy of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), if you're traveling internationally your laptop, cell phone, or PDA can be seized by Border Patrol—an agency of the DHS—without any suspicion and no explanation. Moreover, Border Control can download all your private information—including personal and business documents, emails, phone calls, and web history. If you refuse to let them snoop around in your personal information, they can simply take your device and keep it indefinitely.

The government should have a reasonable suspicion of wrongdoing before doing these kinds of searches. We vitally need legislation that protects the civil liberties of travelers.

For example, the trial of Saber Ragoubi in Tunisia is one that sadly is a shared reality with too many. Saber Ragoubi was tried unfairly and sentenced to death in December 2007. The information used against him was obtained through torture. At his trial, he said: "I was assaulted in Mornaguia prison and lost three of my front teeth; I request an investigation into the assault. I was also stripped naked to force me to shave my beard."
